Installation:

- Copy the "Assets" folder into your Railworks folder (This can be found by going to your Steam Library, right clicking on Train Simulator then Manage - Browse local files)
- Run the "InstallSWR444-450.bat" now located in Railworks/Assets. (Do not run as Administrator)

(When running the bat file, if you have a previous version installed, it will delete some older files from previous versions that would conflict with the files included now, so if you don't have a previous version but it looks like there's an error, don't worry!)

Variations

SWR Ex SWT

Removing ";WF=1" from the unit number will hide the WiFi Antennas.

Adding ";GPS=0" to the unit number will hide the GPS Antennas.

Adding ";SWT=1" to the unit number will change the interior from SWR to SWT.

Adding ";HC=1" to the unit number will add the HC (High Capacity) stickers and remove first class branding on units numbered 450/5 (Only applies on SWT branded units, not SWR)

SWR

White Ribbon - Displayed dependent on the unit number, but they can be hidden on a unit that has the sticker by removing the ";WR=1" from the unit number. This is to replicate the units before they received the sticker.

Branding - There are two branding types (Seen below), old on the left, new on the right. Two consist options are included, SWR(1) old, SWR(2) new. These can also be controlled via the unit number with ";ST=X", X being 1 or 2.

Alex Wardle Name - This is set to always show on 444023, but can be hidden by removing ";AW=1" from the unit number. This is to replicate the unit before it received the sticker.

Transport Benevolent Fund - This is set to always show, but before receiving the sticker, 450100 had a White Ribbon sticker, by default the Transport Benevolent Fund is shown, but changing the ";WR=2" in the unit number to ";WR=1" will show the White Ribbon sticker.

444019 - New Trainbow "South Western Railway" logo on leading vehicles can be hidden by removing ";LS=1" from the unit number

5G Antenna - Can be hidden by adding ";5G=0" to the unit number (SWR Ex SWT too)

Weathering

Included are different levels of weathering, these can be used by adding “;W=X” to the lead vehicle number of the unit placed down, in the scenario editor. Weathering is added to every livery.

X being the number used for the weathering, that ranging from 1 to 4 for the Class 450, then 1 to 5 for the Class 444.

For example, Unit number “ 444017;W=4 “ would show the 4th level of weathering.

Below are some previews of the weathering.





Here are some extra bits which are included, but don't warrant a dedicated section

- TOPS data stickers on all units/coaches.
- Extra passenger view camera positions.
- Cab Forward Facing Camera on SWR units.
- SWT branded stickers removed from cab and replaced with SWR branded stickers on SWR units.
- "D-Day" Name sticker on SWR 444040.
- Some small decals added to SWT Livery.
- Fixed white door button on two 444 trailer coaches.
- Front taillamp hook modelled on all units.
- Redone SWR Logo on SWT Liveried units
- SWR Liveried 450036 has a lower body side stripe.
- SWR Liveried 444038 has a taller yellow portion on the front gangway.
- Electrical cables modelled between coaches above the gangway.
- SWT signage (Bikes, Quiet Zone) added to SWT units.
- Slightly thicker edge around front lights.
- Adjusted SWT interior seat colour.
